Chris Arick, DC, MS – Considerations for Management and Prevention When Conventional Tests Fail

This lecture will discuss integrating with other healthcare practitioners and not competing, as well as how to look at conventional testing and know where to turn next. This course will allow doctors to reflect on patient cases they have had or will have in the future where the results of conventional tests left them with no answers. This lecture will also cover common practice management strategies, which can be applied to increasing revenue in the office through patient retention and satisfaction.

Kenzo Kase, DC – How Chiropractic and Taping Strategies Stick

The chiropractic therapy model is closely related to the Kinesio Taping theory and practice. Dr. Kase will discuss the similarities between the two and the way Kinesio Taping allows the physicians to take treatment to a whole new level. The attendee will leave the program with the general concept of how taping strategies can be beneficial in patient care and as an adjunct therapy.



Nick LeRoy, DC, MS – Natural Treatment and Intervention of Dysplasia and HPV

This lecture will look at natural applications to the care and management of Cervical Dysplasia and HPV in females. The lecture will include treatment strategies based off evidence based literature, which are non evasive and effective. HPV and Cervical Dysplasia account for 50% of the female population. This course will provide a perspective of management for complicated female cases beyond diagnosis and referral. Additionally, research will be covered during this lecture where conventional methods have failed.

Heather Miley, DC, MS, DACBR – Looking Outside the Spine: Abdominal Pathology Commonly Encountered on Lumbar Radiographs

This course will allow the attendee to gain a stronger knowledge on common oversights in the care of patients with low back pain. Additionally, this course will provide information on how to relate low back pain to abdominal pathology.



Craig Morris, DC, MS – Rehabilitation and Chiropractic: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow

This lecture summarizes the evolution of rehabilitation within the field of chiropractic. The international contributions to establishing this dynamic chiropractic specialty will be summarized.
